EWA Secretary General Shares Perspective on EU Water Resilience Plans



We are pleased to share that our Secretary General, Arthur Guischet, was recently interviewed by **ENDS Europe** on the European Commission's newly presented **Water Resilience Strategy**.

The strategy, launched in July by Executive Vice-President Teresa Ribera and Environment Commissioner Jessika Roswall, sets out three main objectives:

- · restoring and protecting the water cycle,
- building a water-smart economy,

 and securing clean and affordable water and sanitation for all.

In the interview, Arthur Guischet highlighted the positive aspects of the Commission's plans, including recognition of long-standing EWA priorities such as a holistic approach to water policy and greater visibility for water in EU policymaking. He welcomed the further development of the Water Reuse Regulation, as well as the proposal to create a European "water academy" to address skills and workforce challenges in the sector.

At the same time, he underlined that some open questions remain – particularly regarding pollutants like PFAS, funding mechanisms through the European Investment Bank, and how member states will implement the strategy's non-legislative measures.

Wilo Industry Conference in Venice Highlights Al Innovations for Europe's Water Future





The annual **Wilo Industry Conference 2025** took place in Venice, gathering leading experts from science, politics, and business under the theme "**Water – Shaping the Future**." Organized by the multinational water technology group Wilo in cooperation with the European Water Association (EWA), the event focused on **the role of artificial intelligence (AI) in tackling Europe's growing water challenges and advancing the EU Blue Deal.**

Speakers, including Oliver Hermes, President [&] Global CEO of the Wilo Group, and Pietro Francesco De Lotto from the European Economic and Social Committee, emphasized the urgent need to treat water infrastructure as critical as energy and defense. Discussions highlighted how AI can provide "significant opportunities" to address water shortages and enable a long overdue European water transition.

The conference featured contributions from Wilo management, the European Space Agency, Siemens, and Emerald Technology Ventures, with Al-driven solutions showcased as a central theme.

Alongside the conference, Wilo's International Meeting of General Managers also placed a strong emphasis on WATER AI, underlining the company's pioneering role in digital and AI innovations for the water sector.

2. EU Reaches Agreement on Water Pollution Standards

The European Parliament and Council have reached a provisional agreement to update the EU's water legislation, marking a significant step toward cleaner groundwater and surface waters. The revised directive expands the list of priority pollutants to include PFAS, pharmaceuticals, pesticides, and industrial substances like bisphenol-A, while introducing watch lists for emerging contaminants such as microplastics and antimicrobial resistance indicators.

3. EU Endorses Conditional Use of RENURE Fertilizers under the Nitrate Directive

The European Commission has welcomed a provisional agreement by the Nitrates Committee allowing the conditional use of RENURE (Recovered Nitrogen from Manure) fertilizers in nitrate-vulnerable zones. This decision aims to support sustainable farming practices while maintaining environmental safeguards under the Nitrates Directive.

4. ECHA publishes updated PFAS restriction proposal

The European Chemicals Agency (ECHA) has published the updated proposal to restrict per- and polyfluoroalkyl substances (PFAS) under the EU's chemicals regulation, REACH. The update has been prepared by the authorities from Denmark, Germany, the Netherlands, Norway and Sweden, who submitted the initial proposal in January 2023.

The European Chemicals Agency (ECHA) aims to complete its scientific evaluation of the proposed EU-wide restriction on per- and polyfluoroalkyl substances (PFAS) by the end of 2026.

This notice explains when the EU expects to finish reviewing a broad PFAS ban (target 2026) and which uses are in scope now. It matters for water services because future rules could limit PFAS in materials and products, shaping utility compliance plans and costs.
