



Political and legal framework



- EC flood risk management directive 2007
- Federal Water Act (WHG) 2010
 - Keywords "Individual Precaution" (§5 WHG)
- Implementation within the framework of public service tasks at local authority level
- Promotion of the audit in Federal States of Bavaria, Hesse and Saxony-Anhalt
- LAWA (Working group of the federal states on water issues) – Recommendations for designing up flood risk management plans of March 2010





Objectives:

- To record the strengths and weaknesses of the existing precautions
- To elaborate together **concrete action recommendations**
- To **support** the responsible persons at the political and public administrative level
- Clarify and verify the foreseen activities and actions to combat floodings together with the state authorities and the public.
- To create **risk awareness**






Content:

Questions from the fact sheet DWA-M 551 as a guiding thread:

35 indicators for the four precaution areas:



- Land-related precautions
- Building precautions
- Behavioural precautions
- Risk prevention
- Evaluation of floods caused by rivers / streams and caused by heavy rain / storm water





The result: Your individual flood precaution traffic lights



- ✓ Reduction of damage or damage potential
- Prioritisation of measures, tangible action recommendations
- Being confronted with the relevant issues due to the profound experiences of the audit experts.
- Coordinated, internal cooperation within the community
- ✓ Clear communication paths
- ✓ Improved regional and urban planning
- Networking between those who have participated in the DWA Audit.

In brief: You are well prepared for floods and flash floods when conducting a DWA Audit!






Process

- Two days together with the community employees in charge and the decision makers.
- Discussion moderated by two DWA expert auditors
- Dealing with and evaluation of all aspects concerning floods directly at the 'round table'
- Shortly after the meeting submission of the minutes and the report













What is the alternative to the audit?

- Wait until the next damaging floods arrive
 - Be confronted with the same burning questions
 - Be under pressure to justify yourself (done a good job ???)
- Being in the News with sad and bad messages!









The costs

Up to 25,000	residents	EUR 12,500	net
Over 25,000	residents	EUR 15,000	net
Over 100,000	residents	EUR 20,000	net
Over 200,000	residents	EUR 25,000	net

✓ In some Federal States the DWA is subsidized. (The administration knows that it is much more cheaper to be prepared!!)
